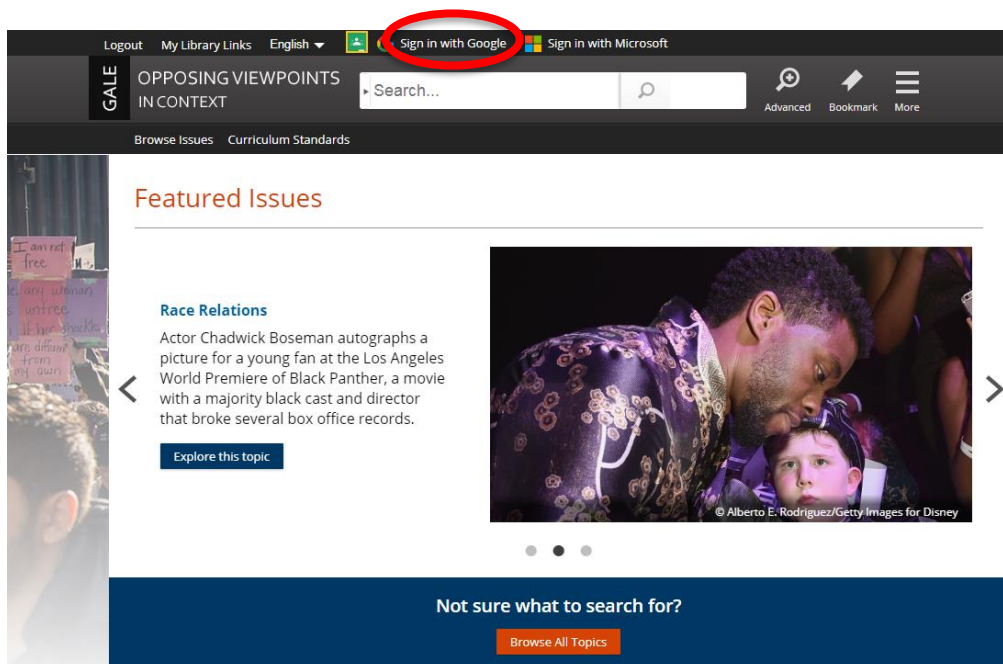


Go to Henry Clay's homepage - - -> Select Media Center - - -> Select GALE Opposing Viewpoints in Context (under the Databases at the bottom of the page)

Access off-campus will require a password – ask or email your classroom teacher or librarian for details.

In order to save content (including citations) to your Google Drive, select the “Sign in with Google” link and enter your FCPS email address & network password.

To brainstorm topics,
click Browse Issues.

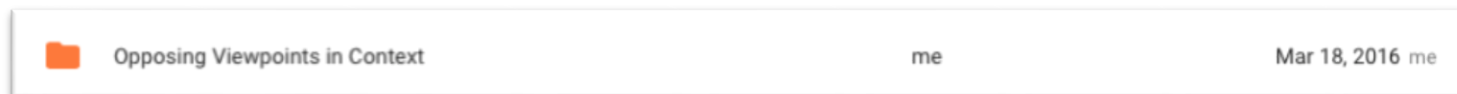
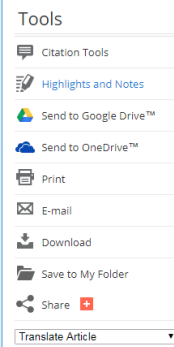


Search from the homepage in the basic search window or select “Advanced” to conduct an advanced search.

Narrow search as desired (*i.e.*, News, Magazines, Biographies, Academic Journals, etc.)

When locating a potential resource you want to save, consider selecting “Send to Google Drive”. For the citation, select “Citation Tools”, choose either MLA or APA format, then under “Export To:” select “Google Drive” and then select “Export”.

All items saved to your Google Drive will go to a specific folder which you can open from an internet browser or from the Google Drive app.

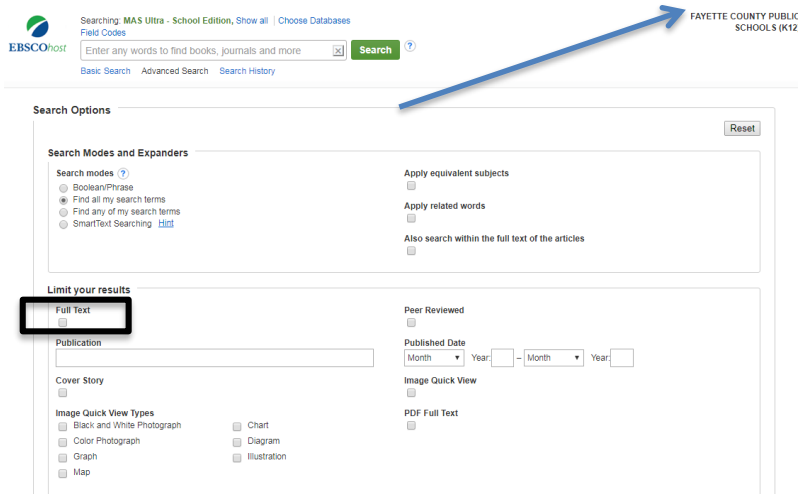
Access off-campus will require a password – ask or email your classroom teacher or librarian for details.

Click For K12 Students - - -> High - - -> EBSCO services - - -> EBSCOhost Research Databases - - -> select the databases you wish to search (ie: AHFS Consumer Medication Information or Academic Search Complete) - - -> Continue (at the top or bottom of the page)



Click Advanced Search.

Select Full Text and any other limiters you'd like to use before typing your keywords in the search box.



Once you find an article you want, use the Tools on the right side of the page to find a citation, download, email, translate into another language, etc. TIP: Saving to GoogleDrive has not been working recently. Please consider downloading to a flash drive or emailing it to yourself.
